# Teams up!

**Teams up! provides funding for international youth exchanges and accompanying or pilot projects. Youth groups from Germany and African countries work together on a joint project for a maximum of two years, exploring one of the United Nations 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).**

## What are the aims of Teams up?

1. Nurturing a new generation of global citizens
2. Strengthening global partnerships and personal skills
3. Raising awareness of and implementing the 17 Sustainable Development Goals

## Who can apply for project funding?

**There are three requirements for Teams up! projects:**

- 1.** There must be at least two project partners – one in Germany and one in an African country.
- 2.** The partner organisation from Germany must pass an implementing organisation assessment performed by Engagement Global and, just like the African partner organisation, must not be of a missionary, governmental or commercial nature.
- 3.** The project partners from Germany and the African partner country make an active, long-term contribution to promote the implementation of the project, acting as equals in the process.

## What types of project are eligible?

- ▶ Development-related youth exchanges for groups of young people between the ages of 16 and 30.
- ▶ Accompanying projects to improve the quality and strengthen the structures of African-German youth exchange.
- ▶ Pilot projects of special relevance to international development-related youth work.

# Team works!

**A powerful partnership: Team works! brings together young experts and more experienced ones in a tandem team to help promote sustainable development. Working in cooperation with the Senior Experten Service (SES), the AGYO gives young professionals the opportunity to spend several weeks on assignment in Africa or Germany.**

**Both the experts themselves and the enterprises they are assigned to benefit from this exchange of ideas and knowledge between two generations and two continents.**

## Team works!...

- ▶ ... is all about working as a team across two generations and continents to foster personal, entrepreneurial and societal development.
- ▶ ... helps young people identify global interdependencies and develop skills and the ability to take action.
- ▶ ... promotes equal partnership by linking up experts from Germany and African countries.

## Who can take part?

Young skilled workers from Germany or Africa who are between 18 and 30 years of age and at the end of their training or just beginning working life. More specifically, participants must be at least in their third year of training or have initial work experience of relevance to the assignment in question.

## Where do the young experts' assignments take place?

The assignments are usually in small and medium-sized enterprises or educational, welfare or medical institutions. The AGYO ensures there is a good match between the topic of the assignment and the young experts' knowledge and interests.
